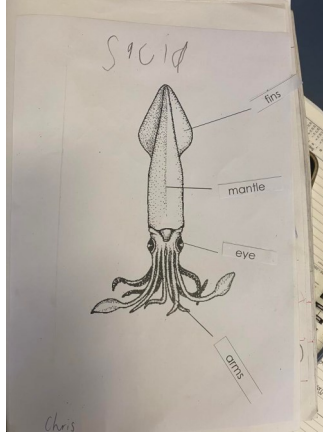
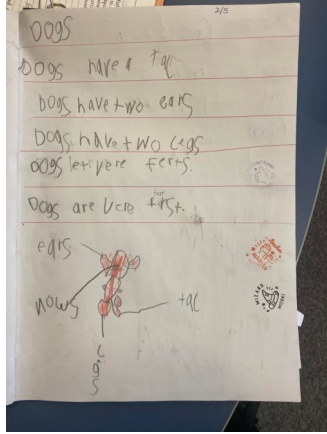
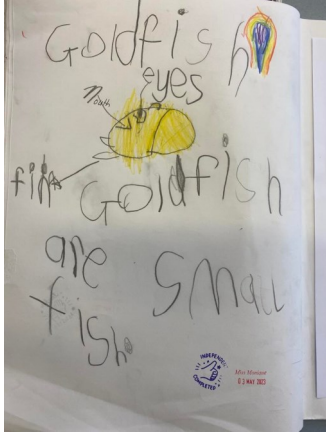

From the Classroom

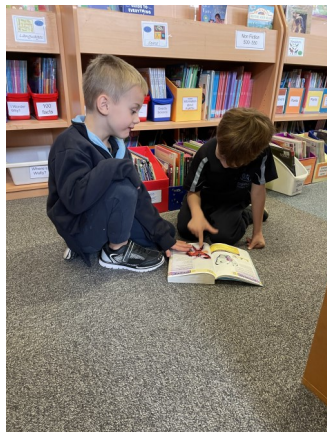
Prep with Monique and Sophie

This week in the Prep room we have continued with information texts in reading and writing. Students have continued to learn about the different features within an information book such as labels, real pictures, contents page and subheadings. Students have expanded their knowledge around animals including Koalas, Wombats, Squids and Manta Rays, so ask your child if they can tell you any interesting facts! In writing, students have been writing a title, drawing a picture and labelling it and then writing a fact about their picture. In Maths, students have started learning about addition (plus, add). Students have participated in different addition activities such as; added their gotcha cards with their friends gotcha cards and added their favourite numbers with their friends favourite number. Students need to remember their reader bag and their hat daily



Grade 1/2 with Amber and Ellie

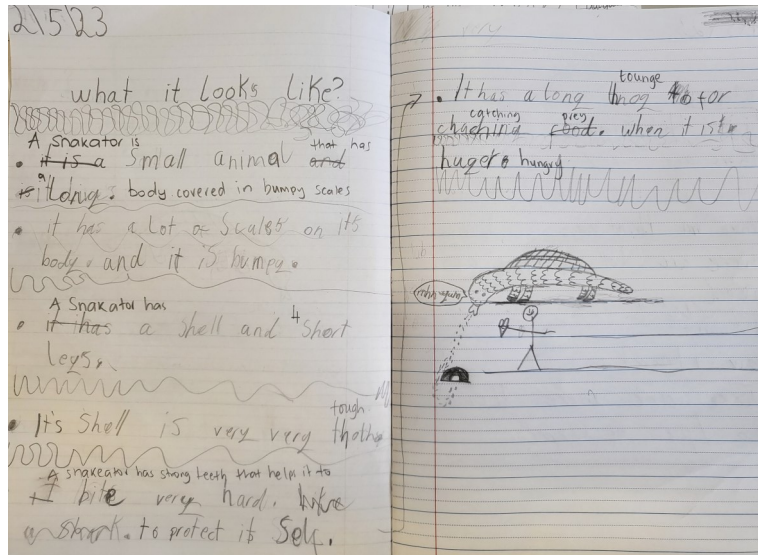
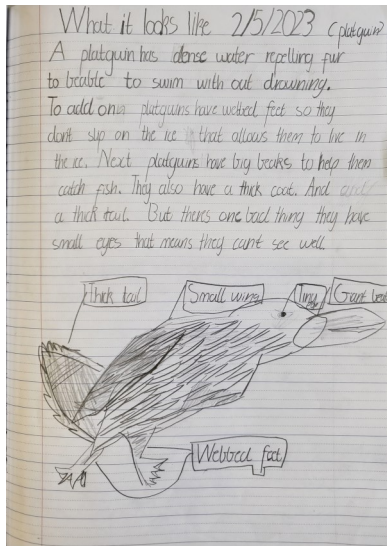
As always, it has been another busy week of learning in the 1/2 area! In reading, we have been practicing noticing new information in a factual text and using the evidence from the text to help us to answer questions as we read! In writing, we have been continuing with the text type of information reports. We have been using the facts that we have found in our reading time to help us to write an information report about rainforests. We have also been learning how to use simple and compound sentences in our writing by using the words 'and', 'because' and 'so'. In maths, we are learning to break a number apart into smaller collections and have been using lots of maths fluency games to help us to practice this skill. Please don't forget to return your library books back to school each week so that you have another chance to borrow another wonderful book! Have a look around home to see if there might be some library books hiding somewhere and bring them back so that another person can enjoy them!



Grade 3/4 with Jess and Stacey

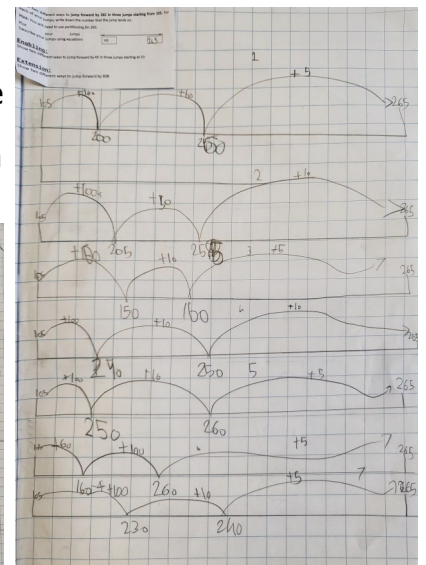
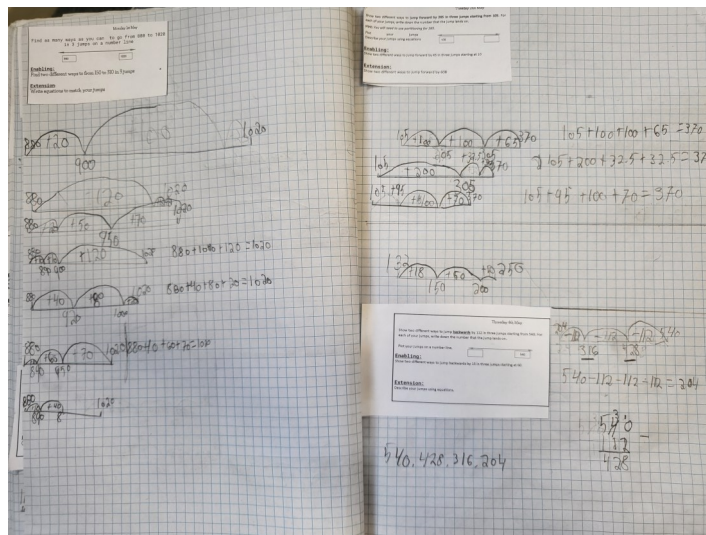
What's been happening in Literacy this week in the 3/4 rooms....

In Literacy this week the 3/4 students have been reading and exploring a variety of Information texts. We have been identifying and discuss interesting, surprising and important information from a text. We have also looked at recognising and using information in a variety of graphics for example, photos, drawings with labels, maps, legends and infographics. In Writing, students have been researching about two different animals – their habitat, what they look like and their diets. With this information we have combined these two animals and made a new one (for example **'Foul' fox and owl**). Students are now planning and drafting an information text about their new animal.



What's been happening in Maths this week in the 3/4 rooms....

This week in Maths students have been learning to use jumps of a number line to show the addition and subtraction of two numbers. Students have explored the concept of bridging to 10 or 100 to help problem solve. We have also been learning how to identify angles for example obtuse angles are greater than a right angle.



4/5/6 with Tayla and Nick

We have been working hard in the 4/5/6 classrooms this week. We started off with athletics on Monday, well done to all the students who attended and did their best! This week in maths we have continued looking at decimal numbers and have started looking at all the different units of measurement. In reading and writing we have been focusing on what good readers and writers do and how we can reflect that in our work. We have started writing information reports about space, history and nature.

Chinese with Ivy

Grade 1&2

The Grade 1 and 2 students focused on reviewing colours, such as 红色(hóng sè/red), 绿色(lǜ sè/green), 黄色(huáng sè/yellow), 蓝色(lán sè/blue), 黑色(hēi sè/black), 白色(bái sè/white), 橙色(chéng sè/orange), 紫色(zǐ sè/purple) and completing a related colouring worksheet

Grade 3&4

The Grade 3 and 4 students have been reviewing about jobs in Chinese, such as 工人(gōng rén/tradie), 老师(lǎo shī/teacher), 律师(lǜ shī/lawyer), 厨师(chú shī/chef), 理发师(lǐ fà shī/hairdresser) and completing a related worksheet.

Art with Jasmine

Prep/1/2 celebrated Autumn this week! We looked closely at the colours and shapes of the beautiful changing leaves around us. Students experimented with using leaves to imagine and create different animals, they came up with some wonderful ideas!



3/4 were also thinking about Autumn this week and they began making a leaf suncatcher. They first traced and then layered tissue paper. We are looking forward to putting these up on the windows to brighten up the art room as the days get colder.

4/5/6 began learning about the Surrealist art movement. We played the game 'Exquisite Corpse' that was invented by the Surrealists. The students were excited to work in groups and come up with some very unusual creatures.

What a crazy week for the PE department this week! We started off with our catchup day for Athletics. The grade 3-6 students were wonderful on the day. Talk to the regional office If you have worked with the school and are not satisfied with the outcome, you can speak with staff at the regional office who will be able to discuss your concerns. The regional staff member may also discuss your concerns with the school or other specialised team members as needed. The regional staff member will contact you to explore potential outcomes. 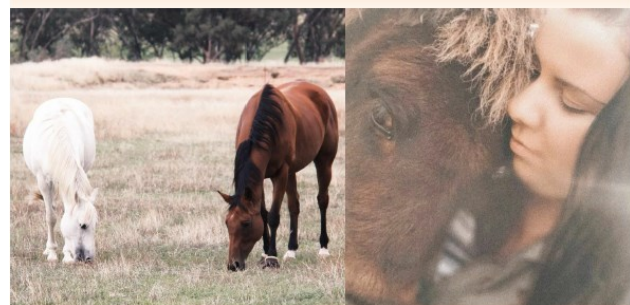

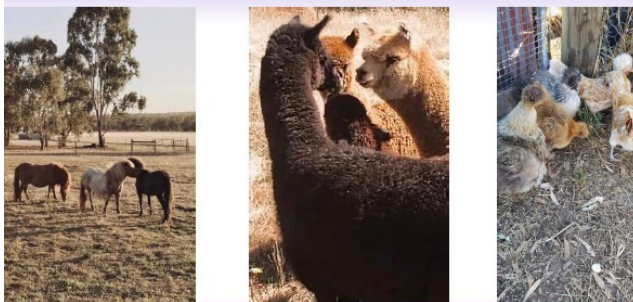
