The Child Safe Standards

*New updates July 2022 The eleven Child Safe Standards are compulsory minimum standards for all organisations that provide services to children, including Victorian schools. The aim of the Standards is to ensure organisations are well prepared to protect children from abuse and neglect.

Victoria's Child Safe Standards

- **Child Safe Standard 1** – Establish a culturally safe environment in which the diverse and unique identities and experiences of Aboriginal children and young people are respected and valued.
- **Child Safe Standard 2** – Ensure that child safety and wellbeing are embedded in school leadership, governance and culture.
- **Child Safe Standard 3** – Children and young people are empowered about their rights, participate in decisions affecting them and are taken seriously.
- **Child Safe Standard 4** – Families and communities are informed and involved in promoting child safety and wellbeing.
- **Child Safe Standard 5** – Equity is upheld and diverse needs are respected in policy and practice.
- **Child Safe Standard 6** – People working with children and young people are suitable and supported to reflect child safety and wellbeing values in practice.
- **Child Safe Standard 7** – Ensure that processes for complaints and concerns are child focused.
- **Child Safe Standard 8** – Staff and volunteers are equipped with the knowledge, skills and awareness to keep children and young people safe through ongoing education and training.
- **Child Safe Standard 9** – Physical and online environments promote safety and wellbeing while minimising the opportunity for children and young people to be harmed.
- **Child Safe Standard 10** – Implementation of the Child Safe Standards is regularly reviewed and improved.
- **Child Safe Standard 11** – Policies and procedures that document how schools are safe for children, young people and students.
- Ministerial Order 1359 provides the framework for child safety in schools.

Prep with Monique and Sophie

This week in the Prep room students have continued their learning around information texts. Students have learnt what facts are and have retold facts from what they have read or heard. Some facts students learnt this week included: "Tiger sharks have eight fins"- Taylee " Water is used for washing dishes"- Eli "Crabs have ten legs"- Hunter. In writing, students have been learning to give their information report a title and write as many facts as they know about the topic. This week's topics included: Water, Crabs, Fish, Orcas and Tiger Shark. For Maths, students have learnt the count on strategy for adding numbers together and played many games to practise this skill. Our school wide focus was -I can use school appreciate words and students received extra gotcha cards for demonstrating this. On Wednesday we were lucky to have the new preps for 2024 join us for Education Week. We played lots of fun games outside including musical dots, egg and spoon race and popcorn using the parachute.

Grade 1/2 with Amber and Ellie

In the 1/2 area this week we have been using graphics such as pictures and diagrams to help us to gain information when reading non-fiction texts. We have used the website 'epic' to find and read lots of different non-fiction books! This wonderful resource can be used at home as well so your child can read books online for free during school hours. This week we wrote desert information reports, which included our researched facts about camels, cactuses and the fennec fox! In maths, we have been working out how to bridge/build to the decade when counting.

Chinese with Ivy

Grade Prep

The Grade Prep students have been learning about numbers 1-10 in Chinese. They can sing the Number Rap. The students also learned about how to write the numbers in Chinese characters.

Grade 1&2

The Grade 1 and 2 students focused on learning about animals, such as 小鸡 (chick), 小鸭 (duck), 小猫 (cat), 小狗 (dog), 小羊 (goat/sheep), 小猪 (pig), 袋鼠 (kangaroo), 熊猫 (panda), 老虎 (tiger), 考拉 (koala). They also played the Mystery Animal game in class.

Grade 3&4

The Grade 3 and 4 students have been learning about jobs in Chinese, such as 学生 (student), 医生 (doctor), 服务员 (waiter/waitress), 运动员 (athlete). They played the Vocabulary Game in class.

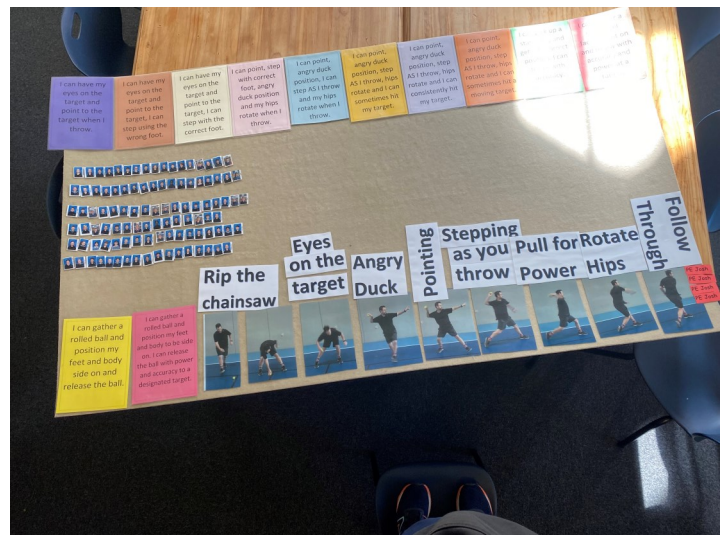
Grade 5&6

The Grade 5&6 students have been reviewing the numbers 1-100 in Chinese and drink words in Chinese, such as 水 (water), 茶 (tea), 可乐 (coke), 牛奶 (milk), 果汁 (juice), 奶茶 (bubble tea). They also sang the song "请给我一杯 (Please give me a glass/cup of...)".

PE with Mr Weymouth

In PE this week all grades have begun learning about the correct technique for the Overarm Throw. We have introduced our learning board which has a Scale of Proficiency to determine what level students are working at. This will help them to identify individual learning goals to work on so they can reach the next level of the skill. This is a valuable learning tool for our students at Eaglehawk and I'm looking forward to seeing some amazing results by using this.

The grades 3-6 have also begun work on learning about different Target games. Their first game was called Finska. We are learning about different strategies that will help us to play the game effectively.
