Public Transport

Reduced public transport fares for regional Victoria

On Friday 31 March 2023, the Department of Transport and Planning introduced lower regional public transport fares across Victoria, including on V/Line, local trains, buses and trams.

This means that weekday travel is capped at a daily fare of \$9.20 or \$4.60 for concession. For shorter regional trips, fares cost less. The daily fare to travel on Victoria's regional network on weekends and public holidays is now capped at \$6.70 or \$3.35 for concession. 

News from the classroom:

Prep with Sophie and Monique

A great first week back in the prep room! We have started information text for reading and writing. Students have been learning all about different features they see in an information book such as labels, real pictures, contents page and subheadings. Some animals that we have read about this week are Dogs and Snails, so ask your child if they can tell you any interesting facts! In writing, students have been drawing a picture and labelling it and then writing a sentence or more of facts about their picture. In Maths, students have been learning about different shapes and sorting shapes into categories.

Students also took their teddies to the Teddy Bear Hospital on Wednesday. Students learnt lots about their bodies, healthy foods they can eat, how to make a plaster for broken bones and lots more!

Grade 1/2 with Amber and Ellie

It's been lovely to see all of the children settle so quickly back in to the school routine this week during our first week of Term 2! The ½'s have been very busy during their reading, writing and numeracy sessions. In reading, we have been practicing the skill of recalling facts that we have read in a non fiction text. We read, cover, remember and repeat what we have just read to help us to practice this important reading skill. In writing, we have continued with our information report writing and have completed a piece about a very popular Australian animal – the Koala! In maths we are reviewing the skill of representing numbers in different ways with MAB, unifix blocks, bundling sticks and money! The prep-2's also had a wonderful time this week visiting the Teddy Bear Hospital! All of our teddys and special toys got to

experience what it's like to visit the doctor or visit the hospital! We learnt about the different organs in our bodies, what happens when you need an operation and got to have our fingers wrapped in plaster! It was very much enjoyed by the children, the teachers and of course, the teddies!







Grade 4/5/6 with Tayla and Nick

This week in the 4/5 and 5/6 rooms we have been learning about and writing information reports on ANZAC day. We also had the opportunity to lead the school ANZAC service at the lone pine tree.

In maths we have started looking at decimal numbers! We got to use bottles and cans of drinks to help visual what is the bigger decimal when given two numbers.

We are looking forward to our athletics day on Monday!

Art with Jasmine

Grade 1/2 and 3/4s have been working on a painted paper collage inspired by the work of artist Pete Cromer. We looked at his book 'Birdlife' and students have created some very colourful and unique birds!







Music with Sharon

Foundation students are learning to identify changes in the dynamics of a song or tune. This week they learnt the song 'Never Smile at A Crocodile' and sang loudly or softly depending on whether the crocodile's jaws were stretched wide or closed. They also followed a percussion score, playing loudly and softly in different sections.

Grade One and Two students learnt an Australian bush dance and sang the song 'Home Among The Gum Trees' as part of their study of Australian music.

Grade Three and Four students learnt to dance 'The Hustle' and play a rhythmic accompaniment to the Bee Gees 'Night Fever' while exploring the characteristics of Disco music.

Grade Four and Five and grade Five and Six students created a variety of rhythmic riffs through the music app 'Incredibox'.

PE with Mr Weymouth

What a jam-packed start to the term in PE! We unfortunately had to cancel our Athletics day on Thursday due to rain.

Our back up day will be next Monday the 1^{st} of May with the students from Grades 3-6 attending the Athletics track via bus. We will be running a compressed version of the day which will begin around 12:45pm and having the students return to school just before 3pm.

Chinese with Ivy

Grade Prep

Grade Prep students have been revisiting greetings in Chinese. They also have been learning about the numbers 1-5 in Chinese.

Grade 1&2

The Grade 1 and 2 students focused on reviewing colours, such as 红色(red), 绿色(green), 黄色(yellow), lán sè hēi sè chéng sè 道 sè 蓝色(blue), 黑色(black), 白色(white), 橙色(orange), 紫色(purple) and singing the colour song.

Grade 3&4

Grade 5&6

The Grade 5&6 students have been learning about Chinese currency. They are able to understand the concept of exchange rate and to work out the conversion of prices of Chinese items into Australian dollars.


STEM Club!
