



Topic 1: Emotional Literacy

Goal: Develop language to identify and describe emotions.

Activity 1: Name and describe the emotions of a character in your favourite TV show. Take turns in doing this with a family member. Goal: Name positive and negative emotions.

Activity 2: Name three positive and three negative emotions you experienced today. Ask someone in your household to name three positive and three negative emotions they experienced. Ask: How did it look, sound and feel?

Prep/One News

This week we have learned two new sounds x (at the end of fox) and qu (queen). We have been busy learning about the difference between fiction (books we read to enjoy) and non-fiction (books we read to learn). This week we read and wrote about ants - they can climb, bite, there is a queen and some ants cannot see.

In Maths we have revisited addition with open ended problems using the book, One is a Snail, Ten is a Crab. We use 'drawing a diagram' as our strategy to solve what animals might be in the paddock if we had different amount of legs.

We hope everyone enjoys their long weekend!

We hope everyone had a wonderful break and are ready for some awesome learning in term three. This term we welcome back Monique who has returned from maternity leave. She will be working in Prep/One on Thursdays. Just a few reminders as we return. Please make sure your child has something healthy to eat for our brain breaks. Also, we often have a lot of jumpers misplaced so it would be appreciated if you could name your child's uniform.

Grade 1/2 Tracey and Grade 2 Bridget

This week in our Grade 1/2 classrooms, students continued exploring fairytales. We focused on learning how to summarise fairytales and find fairytale language in books. Students also wrote retells, adding their own twists by changing the characters, settings, and problems—there were many creative ideas!

In Math, we explored the different ways we can represent numbers using money and continued developing our skills in telling time with analog clocks.

It's been a fun and engaging week of learning. We hope everyone enjoys the pupil free day on Friday!

Grade 3/4 Classroom Update

This week in grade 3/4 we continued to expand our knowledge on fables. In particular, we read a bunch of fables and tried to make a prediction about what the lesson was in the story. We are working on making sure that our predictions come from clues in the text.

In writing, we took the week to carefully plan and write our own fables. We know how important it is that we have a lesson for characters to learn, so we started by brainstorming a bunch of lessons to occur in the story, and made a plan. We spent Tuesday and Wednesday writing, and Thursday we spent editing and publishing.

In maths we worked hard at consolidating our knowledge around multiplication and division. We have created worded problems and drawn diagrams to show our understanding. On Wednesday, we were startled to see our desks covered in tape, as we identified the types of angles and used protractors to measure them.

PE Update - Term 3, Week 2

This week in PE, our **Grades 3–6** students continued to build their **netball skills**, with a focus on **passing**, **moving into space to receive a pass**, **shooting**, **and working as a team**. It's been great to see students communicating on the court and showing strong teamwork.

In Prep–Year 2, students have been working on kicking soccer balls, running with power using their arms, and throwing and catching. These skills are helping them build strength, coordination, and confidence.

WEEK 2 GRADE 5/6

Literacy

HISTORICAL NARRATIVES

This week we have continued working on historical narratives.

In Writing, the students used the research they did last week to write a narrative from another person's point of view with accurate historical details. Throughout the week they focussed on describing characters, creating tension, and developing a conclusion which conveys a message.

During reading, students analysed historical narratives. They focussed on the use of accurate dates, time language, and comparisons between time and how these elements assist the reader in understanding both history and the text.



Numeracy

DECIMALS

This week students have been learning about decimal numbers. Students used MAB to represent decimal numbers in multiple different ways.

TIME

Students have continued their work with time. This week they have been reading analogue and digital clocks, converting between 12 and 24 hour time, and solving problems to do with time that has passed. They particularly enjoyed using the Bendigo Cinema schedule to plan a full day at the movies!

On Tuesday, we went to LaTrobe university. After a welcome talk the students did a scavenger hunt to familiarise themselves with the campus. They then worked with mini robots, programming them to follow an obstacle course. We then went to the TAFE where students were taken on a tour of the workshops covering carpentry, automotive, metal work, welding, painting and decorating, and plumbing.


