## From the classroom

## Prep with Monique and Sophie

This week in the prep room, students have continued to retell the events from a familiar story in order. Students were also given a picture prompt to make up their own story based on a picture. In reading, students have learnt about rhyming words and how they must end in the same final sound in order to rhyme. Students read lots of books with rhyming words and had to spot them. Students also continued to retell the events in a story they have read in order. So be sure to ask your child after they read a book at home to retell what happened in order. In Maths, students have continued to learn about the difference between (e.g. the difference between 5 and 3 is 2 ). Also in Maths students have been exploring length, comparing two objects next to each other and naming which object is longer and which is shorter. Students have learnt that by putting two objects in line with each other they can measure most accurately. In Zones of Regulation and Respectful Relationships, students have been learning that our body gives cues of how someone might be feeling and what zone they might be in (green, yellow, blue or red zone). Students discussed what it looks like when someone is in each zone and tools they could use to maintain or become more in control (regulated).

## Grade 1/2 With Amber and Ellie

In the $1 / 2$ area the students have been making predications as they read. A prediction is a guess you make using text or picture clues. Good readers are constantly making predictions about what might happen next in a text. Our writing this week has focussed on developing characters to use in our fairytales. Students have had to think about what their character looks like, does and a change that will happen to them throughout their story. In maths, we have been practising using efficient strategies for addition. Students are encouraged to think beyond counting on their fingers or counting by 1 s and using strategies such as doubles, near doubles and bridging to the decade.

## 4/5/6 with Tayla and Nick

This week in $4 / 5 / 6$ we have been working hard to perfect and publish our historical narratives based on the Australian Gold Rush. We read students work during shared reading and analysed the texts to find the message. In maths we have continued our focus on adding and subtracting decimal numbers using jumps on a number line. On Tuesday, many of the $4 / 5 / 6$ 's headed off to the Athletics track with Nick and Tayla. We had a great time and came home with many place winnings! We were also lucky enough to have Ryan and Tam from 'InMag' come and talk to us for Passions \& Pathways. We will be working with them over the coming weeks on their next magazine issue!

## What's been happening in Literacy this week in the 3/4 rooms.....

In Literacy this week the $3 / 4$ students have been learning to summarise a story that they have read by including the important parts. We have been including the setting, characters, events, problems, climax and resolution. Students have also been identifying the theme or lesson taught in their stories.


In Writing, students have been using their knowledge from last week's learning in literacy to write their own legends. Legends includes characters that are everyday people or animals, the problem explains how or why something in nature came to be and the resolution is usually magical or sometimes it can teach a lesson. Some titles of these legends have been 'How the Kangaroo got it's pouch', 'The Featherless Emu named Jake' and 'How the Emu got it's short tail'


## What's been happening in Maths this week in the $3 / 4$ rooms.....



This week in Maths students have been continuing to learn and consolidate their understanding of multiplication. We have been exploring and solving real life maths problems using 'times as many'. The students have also been continuing to practise their times tables. Also, this week students have been learning to identify 3D shapes and their properties faces, vertices and edged.

P-2:
Students have continued to work on their soccer kicking skills, utilising the learning board to focus on individual learning goals. They have also continued to have one session per week on the newly started PMP program. They have all settled in nicely to the change and I'm looking forward to seeing growth with the students.
3-6:
Students are starting to wrap up their unit on the soccer kick as we look to move on in the next week or so. Grades $3 / 4$ will move towards the AFL football kick and the $5 / 6$ students into Invasion games which will have a focus on NFL Flag football.
