ANAPHYLAXIS AND ASTHMA

We have several children enrolled who suffer from severe allergies to a variety of things including nuts and nut products, which can result in them going into anaphylactic shock. Anaphylaxis is the most severe form of allergic reaction and is potentially life threatening. It must be treated as a medical emergency, requiring immediate treatment and urgent medical attention.

Strategies to manage asthma & anaphylaxis

Action Plans from the family doctor must be provided to the school for students who have Anaphylaxis and/or Asthma and regularly updated

Parking Parking Services City of Greater Bendigo



Parking Services from the City of Greater Bendigo have contacted our school and requested that the following information be conveyed to our school community.

The illegal parking of vehicles adjacent to our school poses a safety concern to children, pedestrians and other road users. Parents are reminded that it is essential to comply with parking restrictions when dropping off and collecting children from school.

Motorists must not stop in no stopping areas, even briefly, with or without the motor running. They must not stop next to a continuous yellow edge line, on nature strips, too close to school crossings, park over driveways or double park. A number of schools have short term time restricted areas, such as 2 minute pick up drop off. These parking areas are in place to allow for ease of access close to schools and these restrictions must be adhered to. Drivers should also be aware that they cannot perform a U-turn over an unbroken or continuous dividing line.

With regard to children's crossings, the law requires that a driver approaching a children's crossing must drive at a speed at which the driver can, if necessary stop safely before the crossing. Please slow down and take extra care when driving in school zones.

City of Greater Bendigo Parking Officers and Bendigo Police do conduct random patrols throughout the school year at various locations to ensure that motorists are adhering to the Road Rules.

Hats and Uniform

It has been wonderful to see our students proudly wearing our school uniform. School uniforms create a sense of belonging, pride and equality. As part of our sunsmart policy students must wear a school hat to play until the end of May. Hats may be left at school in student lockers or bag boxes. Students without a school hat during Term 1 will be required to play at our undercover area in the shade.

Student Accident Insurance

The Education Department does not provide personal accident insurance for students. Families responsible for paying the cost of medical treatment for injured students, including any transport costs, unless the injury is caused by the negligence (carelessness) of a Department or School Council employee or volunteer. Students' accident

insurance policies are available from the private insurance market. These cover a range of medical expenses not covered by Medicare. They can be obtained by parents for individual students. Parents of students at Eaglehawk Primary School are reminded that Eaglehawk Primary School does not have a whole of school policy.

New Australia-Wide Fire Danger Ratings

On 1 September 2022 Fire Danger Ratings changed across Australia.

- Fire Danger Ratings provide information so people in affected areas can take action to protect themselves and others. The higher the fire danger, the more dangerous the conditions and the greater the impact will be if a fire starts.
- The new system uses better technology and research to determine fire danger ratings and was developed using feedback from one of Australia's largest surveys of communities. The new ratings are designed to be easier to understand and provides clear advice about actions to take.



• There are now four fire danger rating levels. When no Fire Danger Rating is issued, the arrow will point to a white 'no rating' level

Eaglehawk Primary is on the Bushfire At-Risk Register (BARR). Schools and children's services listed on the DET Bushfire At-Risk Register (BARR) will be closed when a Catastrophic fire danger rating day is determined in their Bureau of Meteorology district. A Catastrophic day will be determined by the Emergency Management Commissioner no later than 1.00 pm the day before the potential closure.

Where possible, we will provide parents with as much notice as possible of a potential, and confirmed Catastrophic day closure through Sentral, class Facebook pages, a note and/or school website.

School Captains, Class Leaders, House Captains

Students from years 1-6 have been discussing the above roles, and what they might do. This year students decided that there would be 2 school captains from grade 6, and 2 class leaders for each class except 1 from 5/6 as they will have the school captains as well. Each class form 3-6 will have a house captain if there enough interested

students.

Ashman (blue) – named after Rod Ashman who grew up, went to school and played football for Eaglehawk before becoming one of Carlton's footy greats



From the Classroom:

Grade 1/2

Wow- what a busy and productive beginning to 2023 in Grade 1/2! In maths, students have been learning all about representing numbers to 1000. We have shown numbers using MAB, bundle sticks and money. Student's have also been learning about the value of each digit in its place (hundreds, tens and ones). In reading and writing we have been focussing on Narratives and learning about the different parts, such as the beginning, middle (or problem), and ending (or solution). Well done to all students for an excellent start this year- keep up the great work!









Grade 5/6

The Grade 5/6's have been off to a flying start as will all classes this new school year. We have been working together to create a classroom matrix, brainstorming expectations within the classroom during lining up, working time, group work and also when entering the classroom. Some valuable student suggestions included, 'greeting every classmate when you walk by them in the morning' and 'seeking help from one another when a teacher is busy'.

Along with the matrix, 5/6 have been looking at what it means to create a positive community and culture within the classroom and came up with a list of actions and behaviours they expect from one another and anyone who enters the classroom. Believing that if these actions are followed it creates a calm, collaborative and supportive space for everyone, and wow they are right! Students have and continue to display all attributes and actions needed to form a safe, kind and accepting classroom environment. What a start to the term! We can not wait to see how the entire learning year unfolds, exciting times ahead.
