# Updates from the Classroom:

# **Prep with Sophie and Monique**

Prep update

Preps students have survived a whole week of full days at school, Well done Preps!

In the classroom this week we have been working on reading and writing the words 'look' and 'at'. During reading students have been working on looking at the picture before they read and using their pointer finger to track as they read. In Maths, students have been practising counting forwards and backwards. Students have also been working on ordering numbers from smallest to largest.

In inquiry this week, we have learnt more about friendships, discussing how we can make friends. Students had specific questions they had to ask a peer they were paired with in order to get to know the person.

Another busy week in the Prep room!


# **Grade 1/2 with Ellie and Amber**


The grade 1/2 have been buzzing with a lot of learning this week! In reading we have been practicing our fluency by using punctuation marks to help us to read our sentences. We have also been continuing with our predictions and summaries as we read. It's been very exciting to see that the reading stamina in the children is beginning to increase! In writing we have been continuing with the narrative genre and have produced some fantastic stories this week based on the writing prompt 'I woke up and there was a Pokemon standing in my bedroom!' Our maths learning has progressed with the concepts of 'half' and how to represent this on a number line. We are also practicing finding number patterns on a scaled number line.

# Grade 3/4 with Stacee and Jess

In Reading this week in the 3/4 area students have been reading a variety of fictional texts. We have been learning to summarise important parts of the text and identifying the plot, character actions and the resolution of the problem.

In Writing, students have been planning and developing narratives. We have been focusing on having a plan before beginning our writing and including a beginning, a clear problem or problems and a solution in our narratives.





This week in Maths students have been learning to half numbers that require renaming to help plot these on a number line. Students have also loved playing our fluency game of the week called 'Greater than'.

In Wellbeing, we have been continuing how we can identify own emotions and how we can respond to them in a variety of ways.



# Grade 4/5/6 Tayla And Nick

We have had a busy week in the 4/5/6 classrooms, settling back into school after camp last week!

Numeracy- In maths we have been learning about equivalent fractions and to make equivalent fractions using unlike denominators.

Literacy- In reading and writing we have continued our focus around narratives. We have written stories based on 'the day were everything went wrong' and revised and edited, paying particular attention to our ideas, word choice and sentence fluency.

The year 4/5 class also had the opportunity to show the prep students the school garden! They showed them what has been growing, how we compost and introduced them to the school chickens!

# **PE with Mr Weymouth**

# Preps:

Students have continued to work on building their skills with their locomotor abilities. We have been learning different relay style games where they have been showcasing their skills with running, skipping, hopping etc.

# 1-6:

Students are continuing to build their ball bouncing skills through a variety of small sided games. They will be assessed on their learning next week before moving on to learning the correct techniques for different athletic events in preparation for the school athletics day next term.

# From Chinese with Ivy

# Grade Prep

Grade Prep students had their first Chinese lesson, where they were introduced to the Chinese language and learned to distinguish it from the English language.

# Grade 1&2

The Grade 1 and 2 students focused on learning about Chinese pronouns such as 他(he), 她(she), 它(it), 我(I), 你(you). They wrote these pronouns in their books.





# Grade 3&4

The Grade 3 and 4 students were reviewing the Chinese numbers 1-99. They can now count and recognize the numbers 1-10 in Chinese and are able to listen to a Chinese number and translate it into English.

# Grade 5&6

The Grade 5 and 6 students spent the week learning new Chinese occupations, such as 科学家(scientist), 音乐 giū yuán diàn jìng yùn dòngyuán giú yuán diàn jìng yùn dòngyuán 家(musician), 作家(writer), 网红(influencer), 球员(ball player), 电竞运动员(e-sport player)。

# **Art with Jasmine**

Preps had a lovely time layering different shapes and colours of tissue paper and then painting on it with water.







1/2s created some wonderful self portraits using oil pastels. They worked really hard this week to make their images bolder, colouring in all those white bits!



3/4s completed their mixed media self- portraits. The combination of torn paper and black oil pastel created some very dramatic and expressive pieces.



5/6s began their self- portrait in charcoal, working from a photo of themselves. They are exploring the different

ways we can use charcoal, for example shading and creating contrast.


