Morning Supervision Reminder

Just a reminder that the front doors do not open until 8.30am each morning. Students are expected to enter the school from Brazier St at the end of the basketball courts. Please remind students of this. At Eaglehawk Primary School, the school grounds are supervised by staff from approximately 8.20am before school and until 3.15pm after school. There may be staff in attendance at the school before and after those times, but those staff may be involved in tasks such as meetings or lesson preparation. This means that these staff members will not be supervising students. Some parents accompany their children to school and wait to see that they are settled. This practice is fine, and is certainly encouraged, as parents are supervising their own children. Formal after school care is available, if you are unable to collect your child by 3pm each day.

Road Safety around Eaglehawk Primary School:

To ensure the safety of our children, parents and crossing supervisors at Eaglehawk PS, please remember that;

Under the Road Safety Road Rules 2017, whenever the school crossing flags are displayed, it is illegal to stop

Under the Road Safety Road Rules 2017, whenever the school crossing flags are displayed, it is illegal to stop or park:

20 metres before a school crossing

10 metres after a school crossing

within 10 metres of an intersection

If school crossing flags are displayed, you must stop for pedestrians. You must remain stopped until the crossing is clear.

There have also been some reports of cars not observing the speed limits around our school.

In Eaglehawk, the default speed limit in school zones is 40km/h on declared school days between 8am and 9:30am, and 2:30pm and 4:00pm. Please be aware of your speed as your enter these areas. Together we can create a safe environment for everyone.

In literacy this week, grade 3/4 Jess have been presenting their procedural texts in front of each other as an oral presentation. The students have discussed what a good presenter does as well as how the audience should act. All students should be very proud of their efforts with this ©

Literacy

EXPLANATION TEXTS

In reading, students focussed on the type of language authors use when writing explanation texts. They analysed the authors use of verbs, tense, sequencing words and tier 3 or subject specific language. They also investigated which point of view the write chose to use and why.

During writing, the students applied this learning to ensure they were including relevant and effective language in their own writing.



Numeracy

DECIMALS

Students have been using what they know about multiplying whole numbers to begin multiplying whole numbers by decimal numbers.

CHANCE

Students have been learning language to do with chance such as the likelihood of certain events occurring. They have conducted chance experiments using resources such as decks of cards, dice and coloured counters.

PE Update - Term 3, Week 8

This week marked the **final week of Scooter Ed** for our **Prep-2 students**, and what a fun few weeks it's been! Students loved the program and developed important skills including:

- **Gliding** and maintaining balance
- **Braking** to slow down and stop safely
- **Steering** and controlling their scooter
- Riding safely in a group
- Fitting a helmet correctly

Using **voice commands** on group rides to communicate with others

It's been fantastic to see students grow in confidence and awareness while having a great time on wheels!

In **Grades 3–6**, students have been learning the fundamentals of **field hockey**. We've focused on:

- How to hold the hockey stick correctly
- **Dribbling** the ball with control
- Making push passes
