

From the Classroom

From Prep with Sophie and Monique

This week in Maths students have been learning to plot numbers on an empty number line. Students used different counting patterns such as by 2s, 5s and 10s. We have also continued learning about Mass, this week using balance scales to see which object is heavier. In Reading, students have been learning to make personal connections with something that happens in a story, e.g. a character forgetting to turn the tap off, so this story reminds me of when I forgot my lunch box. In writing, students have been creating their own stories based on a picture prompt. Students had to brainstorm who the characters will be, what the problem is and how it's solved. In Zones of Regulation, students have been learning about triggers and how something can trigger them and cause them to end up in the yellow or even red zone. Students had to think of their own triggers such as loud noises, changes in routine or maybe a particular subject.

Grade 1/2 with Amber and Ellie

You guessed it! Another busy week in the 1 /2 area! We have had so much fun in reading and writing this week, as we have begun learning about procedure texts! A procedure text teaches us how to do

something. The children have read many this week including how to make a symmetrical monster, bubble baths for beginners and many more!

Students have also begun to write their own procedure texts, and they are very detailed! We follow the structure of a procedure text ensuring that it includes a title, goal, materials, series of steps and a concluding statement. In maths, we have been using the language of 'difference

between'. We have used number charts, number lines and worded problems throughout maths this week to practise this skill. We were also fortunate enough to have Leading Senior Constable Wayne Cairnes visit the 1 /2's to discuss the role of police in our community. The children had heaps of questions, and yes, he likes doughnuts! Thank you Wayne!



Grade 3/4 with Jess and Stacee

What's been happening in Literacy this week in the 3/4 rooms.....

In Literacy this week the 3/4 students have been continuing to read procedural texts. We have been looking at the different language used such as verbs, directional language and topic words.




