You will be provided with a PIN to complete the survey. This is to ensure that parents / caregivers / guardians only complete the survey once. The school can never see your responses linked with the PIN.

We would love if as many parents as possible to complete this survey. The responses provide valuable information feedback in what the school is doing well and how we can do things better. From the Classroom

Prep with Monique and Sophie

This week in the prep room for Reading students have been learning about how to explain how a character is feeling using the text and picture clues to support them. For Writing, students have continued to retell stories they have read, however changing the characters and setting of the story (e.g. instead of the hungry caterpillar, it might be the hungry monster). In Maths, students have been learning how to count by fives. Students have also been looking at the patterns in a hundreds chart (e.g. going down by tens, across by ones) and having to put a cut up hundreds chart puzzle back together or find the mistakes. Also in maths students have been learning to measure the length of different objects. Students had to compare two objects, for example, the bubble taps and the bench seat. Students had to say which they thought was longer and discuss what they could use to work it out. Students decided using their book boxes would be a good measuring tool.







Grade 1/2 with Amber & Ellie

In our Reading sessions in the 1/2 area, we have been focussing this week on inferring the moral or the lesson of the story. We have practised doing this different ways – by finding the mistakes that a character is making over and over again, and giving them advice on what they should have done instead. We have also leant, that often the last paragraph will contain a lot of clues as to the final message of a story. In writing, we have been concentrating on fracturing a fairy tale. We have been doing this by changing the endings of various fairy tales and writing our own versions! In maths, we have started looking at the features of 2D shapes and have continued to practise our efficient strategies for subtraction.

Please ensure that EVERYTHING is labelled with your child's name to ensure any missing property can be located and returned to the correct owner. 


What's been happening in Literacy this week in the 3/4 rooms....

In Literacy this week the 3/4 students have been learning to predict the ending of a story. We have used our prior knowledge of the characteristics of text genres to support

our thinking. For example, fables will include a moral or lesson at the end of the story, and legends inform us of how something has become they way it is today.


In Writing, students have been writing the endings of a variety of fables and legends using their predictions from reading a text. Some of these stories were, **The Porcupine and the Snakes**, **The Ant and the Grasshopper**, **The Lion and the Mouse and The Dog and the Shadow**.



What's been happening in Maths this week in the 3/4 rooms.....

This week in Maths students have been learning how to divide. We have been exploring and solving real life maths problems using 'sharing' and 'dividing by'. The students have also been continuing to practise their times tables. Also, this week students have been learning to calculate the length and width of a regular shape when given the area. For example, At the Central Deborah gold mine there are 2 different mines. All the mines have a different area.

If the first mine has an area of 30m2. What could the length and the width of the mine be?



Grade 4/5/6 with Talya and Nick

We have continued working on our Passion's and Pathways projects over the past 2 weeks. We have been lucky enough to go on our roadshow day excursion where

we visited different businesses around Bendigo. Thank you to Bendigo Art Gallery, Long Gully Community Garden, UFS Bendigo, Hoffman Engineering, Bendigo Airport and RMIT Flight School for welcoming us into your places of business. We all had a great time and learnt so much! On Monday we spent the day working with In-Mag and La Trobe Art Institute, we can't wait to share our finished projects with everyone soon. We have curated our very own art exhibition and have been working on items to be published in the next issue of InMag!







PE with Mr Weymouth

P-4:

Students have finished up their learning of the soccer kick with final assessments concluded. We were able to see some amazing growth with their skills which was very pleasing.

They have now moved on to learning the punt (AFL kicking). We have been exploring what a football is and what sorts of things the students could do with a football.

5-6:

Students have finished up their learning of the soccer kick with final assessments concluded. We were able to see some amazing growth with their skills which was very pleasing.

Students have now moved on to learning how to play the game of NFL Flag which has included learning about how to tackle (pull tags from belts) and the beginning of throwing and catching a NFL style football.

Music with Sharon

Foundation students are learning to identify when music sounds high or low. This week they listened for high and low sounds in the song "Up High Down Low" and played a two note accompaniment to the song "Rain Is Falling Down" on xylophones. Grade One and Two students are investigating music from South America. This week they played a rhythm accompaniment to the song "La Cucaracha" on maracas and guiros and learnt the "Mexican Hat Dance". Grade Three and Four students completed their unit on Country music. For the past couple of weeks they have been learning to play "Achy Breaky Heart" on the guitar and "Old Town Road" on the bucket drums. Grades Four and Five and Five and Six students are completing a unit on Tuned Percussion. They have been learning to play the marimba, the metallophone and the xylophones.

Art with Jasmine

3/4/5/6 students have created beautiful Bark paintings inspired by the Papunya artists or Western Desert Art. Students carefully added detail of lines and patterns to create some unique pieces!

Prep/1/2 have been busy weaving. They have explored using strips of paper to carefully weave the paper through a paper loom.

Preps also celebrated the blossoms that are now out all around us by creating their own tissue paper blossom.

What is HIRO?

HIRO stands for, Honesty, Integrity, Respect and Optimism. It's about students being a HIRO, standing up against bullying and supporting themselves and those around them.


What is means to be an upstander:

Being an upstander is about taking action when someone is being bullied or harassed both online and offline. It's about being honest, acting with integrity, having and showing respect, and being optimistic about the outcomes and supports out there (HIRO).

At EPS we strive to build and create a culture around being an **upstander** and seeking the supports that someone needs whenever they experience bullying.

Challenge:

Ask your child about what an upstander is and the things an upstander can do if they see or hear of someone being bullied.











What is bullying?

Bullying is when an individual or group uses its power and strength to repeatedly, deliberately and intentionally use words or actions against another or a group that hurts, threatens, excludes, harasses, humiliates verbally, physically, psychologically or electronically making the victim feel oppressed, traumatized and powerless.

What is cyberbullying?

Sending abusive texts, stalking, making threats, abusive emails, posting unkind messages or inappropriate images on sites, intimidating and deliberately excluding others online.

What bullying is not

- · Disliking someone.
- · Bad moods/ arguments/ being "bossy".
- Accidental or once off incidents physical harm.
- Telling a joke about someone once.
- · Not playing with someone or choosing different people/ groups to play with.

Traditional Bullying

- · Face to face.
- · Can find a safe space or escape.
- · Limited to onlookers.
- · Bully can be identified.
- · Can see facial and body reaction. of target and onlookers.

Cyberbullying

- 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a vear.
- No safe space- hard to escape.
- Shared by a wide audience, can go viral in a matter of seconds.
- · Bully can be anonymous.
- · Harder to empathize with the target.
- · No geographical limitations.
- · The target can easily become the bully.

Cyberbullying

As a parent learn the language, play the games, research the apps they use, role model positive behaviour but don't ban devices.

Encourage your children to:

Be critical thinkers.

Be resilient.

Have empathy for others. Respect themselves and those around them. Remove technology from the bedroom.

Take responsibility for their actions.

Talk about being safe online.

Cyberbullying

What Is Cyberbullying?

Cyberbullying is when a group or an individual uses technology to repeatedly and intentionally hurt or harm a person or a group. It may include:

- · Receiving intentionally hurtful text messages or emails
- · Receiving unkind messages through apps, social media sites or games
- · Spreading rumours or lies about someone online
- · Sending images or videos intended to humiliate or embarrass someone
- · Sending threats to someone
- Creating and using fake online accounts to embarrass, humiliate or intimidate someone

What Can I Do About Cyberbullying?

If you witness cyberbullying, don't ignore it – take action! You could speak up and let the person know that it's not ok. You could also report the content, delete the content and support the target. Be an Upstander!

If you are being harassed or bullied online, don't respond. Save the evidence, tell a trusted adult and report it to the website, game or app. You may also be able to block and delete the sender. If posts or comments are harmful or threatening, contact Police on **000**.

Support services are available to assist you with negative online experiences such as cyberbullying. You can report the incident to the eSafety Commissioner at www.esafety.gov.au or call Kids Helpline on 1800 55 1800.

To make sure YOU are behaving responsibly online, think before you post - slow down! Check laws relating to games, apps and websites. Use good judgement when exploring websites outside of school. Never post a photo or video of your friends without their permission, and never send a message to someone when you're angry or upset.


