In Math, students have been focusing on number lines and learning how to find the halfway point between two numbers. It's been an exciting challenge!



WEEK 8 IN GRADE 3/4 JESS AND JACK!

This week in Literacy the grade 3/4s have been learning all about inferring. We have defined inferred as identifying what a character is thinking, feeling or doing without explicitly stating it. The students have done an amazing job at giving examples from the different stories they have read. In writing the students have been using 'show don't tell' to describe how a character is feeling. For example, rather than saying the character is angry, the students might write 'he stomped loudly down the stairs'

In Numeracy we have been busy using partitioning to find half of different numbers . We have used number lines to show our understanding. Next week we are starting to look at time and read analogue clocks!

WELLBEING

This week, we've focused on belonging and inclusion, with Harmony Day celebrations on Friday highlighting the importance of respect and diversity in our school community. It's been great to see students engaging in discussions and activities that reinforce everyone belongs.

In Student Voice sessions, students explored:

- The Learning Pit Recognising that challenges are part of learning and developing strategies to push through difficulties.
- Noise vs Voice Understanding the difference between complaining (noise) and constructive problem-solving (voice) to create positive change.
 These discussions empower students to take ownership of their learning and school environment in meaningful ways.

DID YOU KNOW?

Children who feel a strong sense of belonging at school are more likely to attend regularly, engage in learning, and develop positive mental health. Small moments—like greeting classmates, sharing a kind word, or acknowledging diversity—help build a more inclusive and supportive school environment.

Encouraging students to be courageous in their interactions, say hello to someone new, or stand up for what's right helps create a safe, welcoming space where everyone feels valued, When children see kindness and respect in action, they're more likely to model it themselves!

THE IMPORTANCE OF USING AGE-APPROPRIATE WORDS

Language helps children understand, express, and navigate their world. Using words suited to their age builds confidence, encourages positive social interactions, and supports emotional development. Modeling clear, respectful language and explaining new words in context helps children communicate effectively and feel heard.

Encourage your child to go for a few short runs during the week, gradually increasing their distance. Running at a steady pace, rather than sprinting, will help build endurance. Art with Sharon



Chinese with Cecila

Grade Prep & P/1

This week in Chinese class, our Prep students had an exciting and creative lesson as they explored a **story featuring a tiger and a fox!**

Grade 1-2

This week, our Year 1-2 students had an exciting hands-on activity learning Chinese numbers through a creative number book project! 😲 🛄

♦ Tracing and Learning Numbers 🍊 📳

Students practiced writing Chinese numbers - (1) to + (10) by tracing the characters on leaf-shaped cutouts. They carefully followed the stroke order to build their writing confidence.

- ◇ Arts & Crafts Fun ۞ 🛠
- After tracing, students cut out their number leaves and decorated them with fun stickers and drawings that represented each number. \P 🐰 👸 🐆
- They then glued the leaves onto colourful background paper to create a beautiful "Chinese Number Book"! 🛄 🧎
- Matching Chinese Numbers with English Words 🟟 💪

To reinforce learning, students matched each Chinese character with its English number and practiced saying them aloud.

Each student proudly presented their number book, showing off their hard work and practicing pronunciation!

Grade 3-4

This week in Chinese class, our Year 3-4 students had an engaging lesson focusing on numbers, math in Chinese, and self-introductions! **4** + 3

- ♦ Math in Chinese Students reviewed how to form math sentences using numbers in Chinese and practiced writing down three different sentence patterns to reinforce their understanding.
 ♣ +
- ♦ Work Check & Stickers After completing their math work, students lined up for teacher review. Those who completed their work correctly received a sticker as a reward! ★ 🐑
- ◇ Self-Introduction Review We practiced "我叫..." (Wǒ jiào... My name is...) and "我...岁" (Wǒ ... suì I am ... years old). Students recalled how to introduce themselves confidently.
- Speaking Activity Each student stood up when their name was called and introduced themselves by saying:

"我叫XXX,我8/9/10岁!" (*Wǒ jiào XXX, wǒ 8/9/10 suì!* – My name is XXX, I am 8/9/10 years old!)

This boosted confidence in speaking and helped everyone practice their pronunciation.



Grade 5-6

This week in Chinese class, our Year 5-6 students expanded their vocabulary by learning new and reviewed occupations through riddles, character recognition, and group investigations! 🛍 🔲

- Review of Previously Learned Occupations Students revisited key occupation words from previous lessons, including:
- 工作 (gōng zuò) Work
- 工人 (*gōng rén*) Worker
- 理发师 (lǐ fà shī) Hairdresser
- 老师 (lǎo shī) Teacher
- 律师 (lǜ shī) Lawyer
- 厨师 (chú shī) Chef
- 学生 (xué shēng) Student
- 医生 (yī shēng) Doctor
- 服务员 (fú wù yuán) Waiter/Waitress
- 运动员 (yùn dòng yuán) Athlete
- Students first read the **characters only**, guessing the meaning and pronunciation.

They then discussed how some characters represent aspects of the job, reinforcing character meaning and formation.

♦ New Learning: Exploring Six New Occupations —

Students learned six new occupation words:

- 科学家 (kē xué iiā) Scientist
- 音乐家 (yīn yuè jiā) Musician
- 作家 (zuò jiā) Writer
- 网红 (wǎng hóng) Internet Celebrity
- 球员 (qiú yuán) Sports Player

电竞运动员 (diàn jìng yùn dòng yuán) – E-sports Athlete

Group Investigation Challenge:

- The pinyin/character flashcards were stuck randomly on the board.
- The **English occupation names** were also displayed in a **random order**.
- Students, in groups of four, used an investigation sheet to match the words and predict their pronunciation.



The team with the most **correct matches** won a reward!

♦ Flashcard Reveal & Reading Practice –

After the activity, students reviewed their answers and **practiced reading the new words together**, reinforcing pronunciation and understanding.
