## From the Classroom

#### **Prep with Sophie and Monique**

In Prep Sophie and Monique this week we have been writing about our friends. Students have written about what makes a good friend and things they like to do with their friends. This week in reading students have a new checklist stuck on their table that they use to tick off as they complete each task such as read the alphabet book, read the word list and read 5 books. In maths students have also been practising writing their numbers and showing 18,19 and 20 with different materials. On Friday we celebrated Harmony Day, students made their very own passports and went to different classes to visit different countries. Students learnt all about different countries and their cultures.

#### Grade 1/2 with Amber & Ellie

It seems that the week just flies by in the 1/2 area! This week during our writing sessions we have been creating the last of our narratives before moving into information texts next week. In reading, we are practicing the skill of being a text detective and answering questions where we have to find directly stated information in a text. In numeracy we have been ordering numbers from largest to smallest and smallest to largest. Our maths fluency game of 'pyramid' has been a huge hit! If you have a deck of cards at home, ask your child to show you how to play!

#### Grade 3/4 with Jess and Stacee

In Literacy this week the 3/4 students have been reading and exploring a variety of Information texts. We have been identifying the structure and key features of these texts. Some of the features students were able to I ocate and discuss from their books included headings, subheadings, labelled diagrams, contents page, index and glossaries. Students have then used their understanding to have a go at including some of these features in their own written information pieces.









This week in Maths students have been learning to order 4–5-digit numbers. We have explored this skill by ordering these numbers using numbers lines, symbols (including < >) and words.



#### **Grade 4/5/6 with Tayla and Nick**

This week students in Nick and Tayla's classes had the opportunity to participate in a Chinese Dragon Dancing incursion organised by Ivy. Student's learnt about the puppets themselves, and how to move to make it look like the dragon was moving as one. Thanks, Ivy, for organising such a fun lesson!





**Reading focus**- In reading we have begun looking at information texts and what makes a good information text. We read about Orca's this week and learnt a lot!

**Writing focus**- This week in writing we have tied up our work on narratives, ready to begin writing our own information reports next week.

**Maths focus**- In maths we have been looking at ordering fractions on a number line with unlike denominators. We have also been looking at location and how to mark coordinates on a map.





We also headed out to the garden on Monday to help Wah Heh with some jobs! Whilst turning the compost heaps, we found a giant clew of worms! Check them out.

#### **PE with Mr Weymouth**

#### Preps:

Students have begun to learn the correct technique for the ball bounce. They have learned this week that they need to bounce the ball on the side of their body, as well as learning about the correct height to bounce the ball. We will continue to develop these skills next week.

1/2

Students have started to learn about different athletics events and have learned how to correctly perform a long jump this week. We will be learning about high jump next week.

#### 3-6:

Students have learned correct technique for the long jump and shot put events for athletics this week. They have also started to give peer to peer feedback which will be a focus moving forward.

As a reminder: Cross Country notes have been sent home, can we please make sure they are returned as soon as possible.



#### **MUSIC** with Sharon

Grades Four, Five and Six students are completing a unit of work on African Drumming. The students are learning to play the three main djembe drumming sounds: the bass, tone and slap; and to play some basic rhythms in harmony.

Grades Three and Four students are continuing their exploration of Rock music. They have discovered that drumming is difficult! They have worked hard to try and coordinate the sections of the beat with different hands and feet while chair drumming. Next week they will be trying to play some simple guitar chord riffs.

Grade One and Two students are continuing their exploration of music from America. This week they identified and played a percussion ostinato pattern to the song "Old Joe Clark". Next week they will be trying to master a cup drumming accompaniment to "Surfing USA".





Preps had fun using expressive lines and colours to create an abstract art work.


1/2s and 3/4s have been very busy painting this week. They were mixing and blending colours to create textured papers. Next week they will use these papers to create a collage of a bird.

4/5/6s did some beautiful contour drawing using black markers. They were looking closely at the small and delicate details of leaves and flowers.









#### **Smile Squad dental packs**

All children deserve a healthy smile, and the Smile Squad free school dental program is working hard to help make sure this happens.

Once your child returns their dental permission forms they will soon receive a free dental pack to bring home, if you complete your form online please let the school know. The dental pack contains a toothbrush, full sized toothpaste, and an oral health brochure. Please take the time to read the brochure. It's full of helpful hints and tips to help your whole family eat well, drink well and clean well – for life. Smile Squad provides standard strength fluoride toothpaste that is generally used by ages six and over, unless recommended by a dental or trained health professional.

If your child is under six, please talk to a dental or trained health professional to find out if your child might benefit from using this toothpaste. You can also choose to put the toothpaste away until they turn six or give it to someone else in your family to use.

#### Do I need to attend my child's appointment?

No, you do not need to attend your child's appointment. You can attend if you would like to, and you can take your child to the community dental clinic if you prefer.
