

#### Grade 1/2 with Amber and Ellie

In the  $\frac{1}{2}$  area, we have continued to practice reading persuasive texts. We have been working on identifying the arguments and the reasons that an author presents in a text. In writing, we have planning out two pieces 'Camping is the best family holiday' and 'Robots should be replace teachers'. In maths, we have been busy learning about transformations like flips, slides and turns. We have also continued to practice our multiplication through using arrays and partial arrays.

#### What's been happening in Literacy this week in the 3/4 rooms....




In Reading this week, the 3/4 students have been learning to critique persuasive texts. Students have been reading a wide range of persuasive texts and then identifying the writer's evidence that supports the

argument. We have then been discussing if these arguments are convincing? If so why or why not?

In Writing, students have been continuing to write a series of clear arguments on a

topic and provide reasons to support. Some of these topics included – 'Weekends should be three days long'.

in Maths this week in the 3/4 rooms.....


In Maths, we have continued to work on fractions. We learnt how to represent counting by fractions

 $(\frac{1}{2}, \frac{1}{3}, \frac{1}{4})$  on number lines.

We have been consolidating our understanding of how to count

forwards and backwards by  $(\frac{1}{2}, \frac{1}{3}, \frac{1}{4})$  from any starting point beyond 1.





## **PE with Mr Weymouth** Prep-2:

Students have now finished their learning on the Two-hand strike. Students have shown some amazing growth with this skill and their understanding of the skill. We will now be moving on to learning the forehand strike (one handed tennis strike). We have also re-started our PMP program on our Tuesday sessions. It was great to see their enthusiasm this week.

#### Grade 3-6:

Students have continued to learn and adapt to the changes in our small-sided Striking and Fielding game called 'Rapid Fire'. The game has been evolving which is leading us to hitting a moving ball with more decision making for the batters and fielders.

#### 4/5/6 Update

This week in reading and writing we have continued learning about persuasive texts. We have looked at different persuasives devices that the writer has used and discussed why they have and have not been effective. We have also experimented with using these persuasive devices in our own writing, including using expert quotes/testimonies and attacks.

In maths, we have been looking at different strategies to solve multiplication problems. Can you solve one of our questions from this week:

Bob and Bri solve this problem (14x6) in different ways.

Bob solved it this way  $14 \times 6 = 28 \times 3$ Bri solved it this way  $14 \times 6 = 60 + 24$ 

How did they solve the problem? What did they do differently?

Create a problem using their ways (at least 2)

In wellbeing we have focused on our school wide matrix link of 'I use my manners' and have been making sure we are using them in the classroom and the yard.

We also headed up to the garden this week and helped Wah Heh with jobs such as feeding the chickens, turning the compost and spreading soil.







#### **Art With Sharon**

Prep students have continued their study of colour. Through paper collages and paint washes they have been learning about primary and secondary colours.

Grade One and Two students have been exploring the

effects of lines. This week they wove spider webs using wool and paper plates.

Grade Three to Six students have been exploring contrast. This week they looked at the effects created when arranging light against dark.







## Chinese with Phoebe Grade Prep

The Grade Prep students reviewed the greeting words (ni hao ma, wo hen hao, xie xie, zai jian), self-introduction sentences (ni hao, wo jiao ...), and the sentences to tell their age (wo ... sui) in Chinese. Cathy songs were sung together to refresh their memory.

#### Grade 1&2

The Grade 1 and 2 students reviewed numbers (0-10), colours, animals, and family members in Chinese. Cathy songs and raps, including number rap, colour song, I love my animal song, and I love my family song, were sung together to refresh their memory.

#### Grade 3&4

The Grade 3 and 4 students reviewed self-intro sentences, including introducing their name, age, school, year level, birthday, family members, and dream job. They also made a mini story book about themselves to reinforce

their memory.








#### **Grade 4-5 Tayla & Grade 5-6 Nick**

The Grade 4-5 & 5-6 students started the exploration of Beijing and focused on the learning about the food and famous tourist attractions in Beijing. Relevant videos were played to help them build up knowledge about Beijing and questions were provided along the videos to check their understanding. Moreover, they also learned to say the names of those food and tourist attractions in Chinese and wrote a postcard to introduce what they know about the Great Wall of China.
