

# Remembrance Day Service, November 11th 2.40pm - Presentation of Claude Brown Scholarship

The 2025 Claude Brown Scholarship will be presented at the School Remembrance Day Service on Tuesday, 11th November.

The Eaglehawk Primary School played a very important role in the lives of one Eaglehawk family. For most of them it was the only education they received, but they valued it and they encouraged their children to pursue further education.

Claude Brown was one of 12 children in his family who attended Eaglehawk Primary School. Sadly Claude lost his life while serving his country in World War 2 as a member of the Australian 2/4th Anti Tank Regiment in action in Malaya in 1942.

Claude's sacrifice was never forgotten by his family and they created a Scholarship fund in memory of their Uncle, to assist in the education of students at Eaglehawk Primary School. The Scholarship will be awarded to a student who consistently displays behaviour and attitudes in accordance with the Eaglehawk Primary School values of Caring, Community, Honesty, Learning and Respect.



# WHAT'S BEEN HAPPENING IN THE 5/6 AREA THIS WEEK....

# LITERACY

This week in reading, students have explored persuasive texts and advertisements. Students learnt to analyse and evaluate advertisements, recognising words that help to show tone and the writer's attitude. They identified information that reveals the writer's attitude towards the topic, explained why the writer has chosen to use positive words and inferred the tone and attitude of the text. They have also identified words or phrases that create a tone, described how these words or phrases reveal the tone and explained how the illustrations support the tone and attitude of the text.

This week in writing, students have focused on understanding various ways of presenting persuasive arguments, such as advertisements. Students learnt to plan a persuasive advertisement based on a product to be sold, including a main idea (the product) and arguments to convince the audience to buy it. Students worked on using research to support their arguments, identifying a clear audience for their product and including a statement that captures the audience's attention. They have also introduced their main arguments or claim to show their opinion and used careful word choice to make the audience feel confident in their arguments.

# **NUMERACY**

This week in maths, students have been continuing to learn about how to use BODMAS, so we can solve complex multi step problems.

They have continued to explore chance experiments, predicting outcomes, identifying equally likely events, and comparing expected results with what actually occurred.


