School preparations for the bushfire season

Each year, to prepare for bushfires and grassfires, schools and early childhood services complete a range of activities.

The Department of Education runs an annual fire risk assessment of schools and early childhood services. They are allocated a category of risk (categories 0 to 4) and are published on the Bushfire At-Risk Register (BARR). All schools and early childhood services listed on the BARR and Category 4 list will also close when a Catastrophic fire danger rating day is forecast in their fire weather district.


When the Bureau of Meteorology provides public fire danger rating forecasts or fire weather warnings, they use fire weather district areas. In Victoria, there are 9 fire weather districts, which are based on Local

Government Area boundaries. Our school is in the Northern Country fire weather district.

As part of preparing our school for the fire season, we have updated and completed our Emergency Management Plan and reprioritised any maintenance works that may assist in preparing for the threat of fire and cleared our facility's grounds and gutters.






1/2 Update

This has been a SUPER busy week for the 1/2 's! Along with swimming and our excursion to Billabong Ranch, the children have launched into the reading and writing of poetry! We have been looking at acrostic poems! We learnt that acrostic poems use verbs (doing words) and adjectives (describing words) to help describe the topic. Here are some examples that the children have been writing about friends and Christmas!

In maths, we have been revising the concept of subtraction. We use our known strategies to solve problems, such as Number lines and using expanded form.









A week in grade 3/4 Stacee and Jess

This week in literacy students have started learning about poetry. We have looked at two different types of poems this week, Haiku and Diamante.



We have been learning about the structure of each poem and then having a go at writing our own.

In Maths students have continued working on fractions.
We have looked at sharing out a pie cut into 6 equal pieces between family and friends. Students have also had a go at representing fraction as mixed numbers (e.g. 4 ½).



4/5/6 Update

We have had a busy week in 4/5/6 with trips to the pool and Eaglehawk Secondary College! We are so excited to be slowly starting to wrap up our learning and publishing all our work from throughout the year! Grade 6 students have been busily working on their speeches for graduation too!

In reading and writing we started our new unit on poetry. We have been reading and writing ballad poems, identifying the stanzas, rhyming pattern and syllable counts!

Check out this poem from Sophia this week:

I got out of bed and suddenly remembered,

The task that I had meant to do.

How could I forget my teacher's reminder,

That today my maths mate was due!

I went to school that day,

ART WITH SHARON





Prep students explored how charcoal can be smudged and rubbed to create different effects. They drew a koala in charcoal and tried to give it a soft texture by smudging the outlines. Grade One and Two students followed instructions on how to draw a lion's head. They colored the head in pencil, and then used watercolors to paint the mane. This created a lovely contrast in textures.

Grade Three and Four students tried their hands at foil embossing. They are in the process of making foil fish.

Grade Four and Five and Five and Six students have completed their Mungo inspired art works. They are now beginning a dragon eye art piece. They are concentrating on creating interesting textures and details.

Chinese with Phoebe

Prep

The prep students learned 6 family member words, including dad 爸爸[bà ba], mum 妈妈[mā ma], older brother哥哥[gē ge], older sister 姐姐[jiě jie], little brother 弟弟[dì di], and little sister 妹妹[mèi mei]. They learned the words by creating gestures for each one and listening to the *I love my family* song. Moreover, they also played the *what is missing* game to get familiar with the pronunciation of these words.

Grade 1&2

The Grade 1 and 2 students reviewed the two sentence structures (水果好吃/不好吃。The fruit is yummy/yucky.) from last week and learned the sentence "水果很好吃(The fruit is VERY yummy.)" in Chinese. They created the gesture of putting thump-up above their head to mean "very yummy" and they practiced the sentence structure through playing *open the boxes* and *sentence unjumble* games.

Grade 3&4

The Grade 3 and 4 students reviewed the 8 hobby words from the previous two weeks, including 跑步 (running), 跳舞 (dancing), 唱歌 (singing), 听音乐 (listening to music), 画画 (drawing or painting, 看书 (reading), 看电视 (watching TV), and 玩游戏 (playing games). They also learned the sentence structure to tell the hobbies they like or dislike "我喜欢/不喜欢······。" They practice using the sentences through playing the *random wheel* and *sentence unjumble* games.

Grade 4-5 Tayla & Grade 5-6 Nick

The Grade 4-5 & 5-6 students continued the exploration of giant pandas. They learned about giant pandas' body parts, which included 头 head, 脸 face, 手 hand, 脚 foot, 眼睛 eye, 耳朵 ear, 鼻子 nose, 嘴巴 mouth, and 尾巴 tail. They practiced through drawing monsters according to their partners' Chinese instructions and introducing the monsters they designed. Moreover, they also finished the worksheet to match the body part words with giant pandas' body parts.


