

Prep students have been learning about texture. They created collage pictures of dinosaurs using materials with a variety of textures.


Grade 1/2 Update


The 1 /2 area has been buzzing with learning and rewards! 1/ 2 Ellie celebrated with cake making and 1/2 Amber celebrated their Gotacha total with icecream creations! For reading, the children have been finding emotive language in persuasive texts. Emotive language are words that the author uses to help us feel a particular way. For example, "birthdays are full of unexpected surprises and joy" help us to feel excited! We have been transferring the emotive language we have been finding through our reading into the persuasive texts that we write. In maths, we have been using directional language such as up, down, left, right and forwards to help us to give directions.

A week in grade 3/4 Stacee and Jess

This week in Literacy we have been reflecting on our time on camp. We have been writing a persusive piece 'school camp is the best'. The students have loved sharing about what made school camp so great and have written a persuasive piece convencing everyone to go on school camp. The students have also learnt about different persuaive devices 'rhetoical questions' and 'attacks' to add to their arguments.

In Maths we have continued to look at fractions. We are learning to count by $\frac{1}{3}$, $\frac{1}{3}$, $\frac{1}{3}$ and mixed fractions on number lines.





4/5/6 Update

This week in 4/5/6 we have been looking at print and video advertisements. We have been learning to infer the mood and tone of the piece and discuss which parts show the writer's attitude. In writing we have began developing our own brand and product to create an advertisement for. We have used our skills on Canva to create a logo and catchy slogan.

In maths, we have been learning to find a percentage of a whole number (e.g. 10% of 800). Students have used the skill of finding 10% to then find larger percentages (e.g. 30% of 800 = 10% x3).

Our school wide focus of 'I use all of my equipment safely' has generated good discussion of what it really means to use equipment safely both inside and outside of the classroom.

Chinese with Phoebe

Prep

The prep students learned a Chinese story about tiger and fox this week, which is called 狐假虎威. They learned the pronunciation of 虎 (tiger) and 狐 (fox) in Chinese and watched a video to learn the story. Moreover, they also did a colour-in worksheet about it.



Grade 1&2

The Grade 1 and 2 students continued to learn another four Chinese words regarding fruit this week.

These included 香蕉 (banana), 苹果 (apple), 葡萄 (grape), and 草莓 (strawberry). They practiced these words through playing the N+1 game and singing the fruit song.


Grade 3&4

The Grade 3 and 4 students learned 5 hobby words in Chinese. These included 跑步 (running), 跳舞 (dancing), 唱歌 (singing), 听音乐 (listening to music) and 画画 (drawing or painting). They also learned two Chinese radicals (mouth radical and feet radical) to help them memorise the Chinese words. They practiced these words through having a competition with the Chinese teacher and singing the hobby song.

Grade 4-5 Tayla & Grade 5-6 Nick

The Grade 4-5 & 5-6 students finished the exploration of 4 Chinese cities (i.e., Shanghai, Hong Kong, Xi'an, Beijing) by singing the city rap song. They practiced either in groups or individually and some of them came up to the front to perform in front of everyone. Moreover, they also put down 3 facts they remember from learning the four cities on the worksheet.




