COVID update

There is at present an increase in community transmission of COVID-19 in Victoria. You can help us keep our school as safe as possible by taking 2 important steps:

- 1. Ensure your COVID-19 vaccinations are up to date. Information on how and where to get vaccinated is available on the Get vaccinated webpage.
- 2. If your child shows symptoms of COVID-19, please ensure they stay home and get tested. The easiest way to test is to use a rapid antigen test (RAT). [Optional, please adapt or delete as appropriate: We have RATs available at our school for collection.] Free RATs are available from your local council where you can collect 2 packs of 5 RATs and an extra 2 packs for each person in your household. People with disability and their carers can get 4 packs of 5 RATs. You are not required to have a Medicare card and you can collect RATs as many times as you need. You can also buy RATs at supermarkets, pharmacies and other retailers.

If your child has symptoms but tests negative, please ensure they stay home until they no longer have symptoms.

If the RAT test result is positive, please ensure they stay home for at least 5 days and until there are no more symptoms. Thank you for your support – these steps will help us all stay well.


Statewide Transition



Prep Update

This week in the Prep room for Writing students have started writing stories. We have discussed what a story needs to include such as a beginning, middle (problem) and ending (solution). We have been reading students' previous stories from term 3 and working out how we could improve the ending of the story to include more detail of how the problem is solved. In Reading, students have been reading stories and identifying the problem and how the problem was solved in the story. In Maths, students have been making models of numbers using MAB. Students have also been learning about collecting data (e.g. what students favourite colour is) and making graphs.

What's been happening in Literacy this week in the 3/4 rooms.....



In Reading this week, the 3/4 students have been learning to analyse the persuasive devices used to persuade the audience in the text. Students have

been reading a wide range of persuasive texts and then identifying rhetorical questions, attacks, statistics and quotes. In Writing, students have been continuing to write persuasive texts including the persuasive devices identified in their reading.






What's been happening in Maths this week in the 3/4 rooms.....


In Maths, we have continued to work on fractions. Students have learnt how to identify and create equal parts of a whole and representing these fractions as proper and mixed fractions. Students have also been focusing on grid references. We have played the game of 'Battle Ships' to help consolidate our understanding of

plotting and reading grid coordinates.



1/2 Update

In the 1/2 area this week we have been wrapping up our reading of persuasive texts. This week we have been looking at high and low modality words. These are words that writers use to help them to express their opinions in a persuasive text. The higher the modality word, the stronger the language and the more persuasive the author is.



In writing, the children have been producing some excellent pieces! We have been using the modality words

we find in our reading to practice using in our writing. This week we have been writing about why we should be allowed to wear PJ's to school! In maths, we have been revising the concepts of subtraction, division and wrapping up our learning on partial arrays.


4/5/6 Update

This week in 4/5/6 we have been comparing and contrasting essays and print advertisements on the same topic. We have discussed features of both, the mood and tone and which we find to be most persuasive. We have been working hard in writing to publish our own essays, ensuring we follow the publishing guide so that our essays are set out correctly with the correct font, size, line spacing, paragraphs, **bold** and *italic* text.

In maths we have started looking at BODMAS (Brackets, Orders, Division, Multiplication, Addition, Subtraction). See if you can solve this question:

Solve the following BODMAS equation: Give as many different equations as you can. $(a \times b) + 5^2 \times (c \div d) =$

In wellbeing time, we have looked at our school wide focus of "I use school appropriate words" and what's this looks like in the classroom and the yard. During Respectful relationships, we looked at problem solving and sorted scenarios into 'handle yourself', 'help from a mate' and 'help from an adult'.







Chinese with Phoebe

Prep

The prep students learned a Chinese song called "两只老虎(Two tigers)". They learned the meaning of the lyrics by doing some body movements as they sang the song. Besides, they also learned the pronunciation of "虎(tiger)" in Chinese. They took the worksheet home to make a tiger headband.



Grade 1&2


The Grade 1 and 2 students reviewed the 8 fruit words from the previous two weeks and learned sentences to say "水果好吃/不好吃(The fruit is yummy/yucky.)" in Chinese. They practiced the sentences through playing carddrawing game.

Grade 3&4

The Grade 3 and 4 students reviewed the 5 hobby words from last week and learned another 3 hobby words in Chinese. These included 看书 (reading), 看电视 (watching TV), and 玩游戏 (playing games). They practiced these words through playing the game *tapping on the flashcards* and the worksheet *secret codes*.










Grade 4-5 Tayla & Grade 5-6 Nick
