From the Classroom:

Prep with Sophie and Monique

This week in the prep room, students have been learning about the setting of a story.

Students have had to use the picture and text clues to think about where the story is taking place (e.g. beach, farm, forest or home). In writing students have had to get creative and change the characters (people/ animals) and setting (where they are) in known stories like Mrs Wishy Washy and Magpie and the Three Bears. This week marked the conclusion of our subtraction focus in maths.





Students demonstrated their learnings around take away and difference between by applying it to worded tasks . Also in Maths students have been exploring length,

comparing two objects that can't be moved next to each other. They measured using paperclips and their own feet. In Zones of Regulation students listened to a story "The way I feel" and discussed how people can move through different zones throughout the day. Students also worked in teams to sort pictures of the character in this story into the different zones based on their body language.

From PE with Mr Weymouth

P-2:

Students have continued to work on their soccer kicking skills by focussing on accuracy. They have also incorporated the soccer dribble into some activities as well. The PMP program continues to grow each week as the students now know the routine and are becoming familiar with the activities.

3/4: Students were introduced to a new soccer kicking based game this week which worked on accuracy by trying to hit moving targets. They also worked on giving peer to peer feedback to a classmate to help them Identify one thing to work on and also one thing they are doing well.

5/6:

Students were introduced to a new soccer kicking based game that incorporated all aspects of a soccer game in a fun and exciting way. They will move on next week to learning about invasion games, specifically working on NFL Flag Football.
